On February 3<sup>rd</sup>, our branch held the first of hopefully several learning workshops to raise funds for the scholarship. Eight members met at the home of Penny Hansen to enjoy a workshop presented by Judy Hale. Judy taught us how to knit a scarf using Sashay Lace yarn. We all made mistakes, but laughed with each other and enjoyed talking about books and other interests as we worked. At the mid-point, we took a break to enjoy the desserts donated by several members. Our crafty afternoon netted \$160 for the Marylhurst scholarship fund.

Our February 9<sup>th</sup>, our branch hosted a presentation by Tyler Russ, a Canby resident who recently returned from a year working with the Peace Corps in Rwanda. Tyler taught at a school and lived in the local community. He spoke about overcoming a cultural taboo he encountered among his students – admitting one does not know something is viewed as a loss of face. He also noticed that students possessed a great potential for creativity, but did not have an outlet. The Rwanda Guitar Workshop he developed addressed both of these issues. He raised funds from a group of former Peace Corp workers located in Oregon to purchase 11 guitars from a Rwandan craftsman. Learning to play a guitar provided students with a creative outlet and the classes were a safe place for students to make mistakes as they learned to play.

Before the presentation, attendees had an opportunity to buy books donated by members (our Bring and Buy Book Sale) and accessories left over from the sale held at our tea last year. We raised \$132 for the scholarship.

On March 9<sup>th</sup> (our annual branch meeting), you have another opportunity to help raise funds for the scholarship. We will hold Part 2 of our Bring and Buy Book Sale. Please bring books to donate and purchase books to take their place on your shelves! During the meeting, I will get the book tables set up. After the meeting, everyone will have an opportunity to find a new favorite book, or two, or three. Please help us make this fundraiser a success.
