My daughters were enrolled in Suzuki violin at Marylhurst and I thought that the harps in those music rooms were the most beautiful, graceful instruments that I had ever seen. One day, while I was waiting for my daughters, a football player with a torn, grass stained shirt entered one of the music rooms and began to play the harp. From that moment on, I was hooked. When I contacted Sr. Emerita about lessons, she looked at my hands and said they were "passable" for playing the harp. She also said that she didn't usually take beginning adult students; however, my daughters were talented and they must have gotten their skill from someone, so she would give me a chance. Thus began my love affair with the harp.

For many years, the harp was a hobby and a pleasant "on-again, off-again" distraction from my job as an insurance company executive. After retirement, I began playing much more often and I am now enrolled in a contemplative music program offered through a combined effort between "The Chalice of Repose Project" and St. Catherine's University in Minnesota. Upon completion, I intend to enroll in their Music Thanatology certification program. Music thanatologists use prescriptive music to help ease symptoms and provide comfort to patients who are at the end of life. This music can also be very comforting to their families and caregivers.

I currently play the piano or the harp for various services at St. John the Apostle Catholic church in Oregon City."

Sometimes I feel like all I talk about in the Buzz is fundraising. The reality is that the Board spends a considerable amount of its time working to achieve this Branch goal. If we are to be successful, we need the assistance and participation of all members. Our Branch currently funds a \$1,000 Marylhurst scholarship and donates \$1,000 to AAUW Funds each year. This means that, if members wish to continue funding these items, we must raise at least \$2,000 each year.

Our major event this year was Collectible Discoveries held on April 14. Last year

approximately 40 people attended this event.

This year, despite more extensive advertising, there were only 16 attendees (14 members, 2 spouses). With the sale of one iPod docking station and other donations of \$12, the event raised \$192. If the copying costs for the event flyers and counter cards had not been donated, less than \$100 would have been raised. The Board and a handful of other members (mostly those who attended), spent an incredible amount of time arranging and advertising this event. The small attendance was very disappointing to everyone.

I wish to thank Barbara and Michael Bridges, owners of Bridges Estate Sales, who responded to my call late Thursday after the scheduled presenter, Laura Angel (Sixpence Antiques), backed out on Tuesday. The Bridges did

a fine job! Between them, Judy Hale and Jane Taft called more than 20 antiques dealers attempting to find a replacement presenter. We are thankful for their efforts. I also offer my thanks to the Board and other members who spend so much time arranging the event and baking cookies.


Docking Stations for iPhones - iPod's
