

New Member Profile By Jeanne-Marie Pierrelouis

New member Lynn Bliss is a relative newcomer to Lake Oswego, having moved here last year to be nearer to her sister and her family. Lynn's long career in teaching and practice in speech pathology began with an experience in high school, when she could not communicate with a young woman with cerebral palsy who had difficulty speaking. Guided by that desire to communicate and help, she sought an undergraduate degree at Boston University and the University of Wisconsin, and then a Master's degree in Speech pathology at Teacher's College, Columbia University in New York. After several years of work in New York, she was accepted into the PhD program at the University of Michigan. Upon completion of her PhD, her path as a professor and administrator in higher education took her to Pennsylvania (Penn State) and Michigan (Wayne State), and then Texas (University of Houston).

She has traveled in Europe, and received a Fulbright grant for a four-month professional experience in Cyprus.

Lynn is a docent at the Oregon Jewish Museum and Holocaust Memorial, and will host an upcoming visit planned by our "Exploring the Northwest" interest group. She was a docent at the Houston Art Museum, and is exploring similar opportunities at the Portland Art Museum. To relax and unwind, Lynn enjoys needlepoint. Celebrating 130 Years of AAUW American Fellowships

The American Fellowship program is the oldest and largest of AAUW's fellowship and grants programs. It was founded in 1888, a time when women were discouraged from pursuing higher education. Now one of the largest sources of funding for graduate education for women, the program has supported more than 5,000 women scholars who are completing dissertations, taking research leave from their colleges or universities, or finalizing Research for publication – three critical points in a woman's academic career.



One such recipient was Nettie Stevens (1908-1909). She was one of the first women in the field of genetics; she is co-credited with the discovery of sex chromosomes. The pair of sex chromosomes that she studied subsequently became known as the X and Y chromosomes.
